1. CALL TO ORDER:

Committee Chairman Wiseman called the Operations, Properties, and Facilities Committee to order at 3:00 P.M. The meeting was held via videoconference.

4. ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA:

MOTION BY COMMITTEE MEMBER VOSS, SECOND BY COMMITTEE MEMBER CALDWELL, CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, to approve the agenda as presented.

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS: None

6. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

MOTION BY COMMITTEE MEMBER SAMLASKA, SECOND BY COMMITTEE MEMBER Schoeffler, COMMITTEE MEMBERS CALDWELL, PARK, AND VOSS ALL ABSTAINED, to approve the Operations, Properties, and Facilities Committee Meeting Minutes of November 5, 2025.

7. ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS:

7.A Parking Access and Revenue Control System (PARCS) Update

The committee received an update on the procurement process for parking access and revenue control system. The process is in the final negotiation stage, with a contract award anticipated in late February or early March, pending City Council approval. A panel of evaluators, including internal staff and external parking experts, reviewed six proposals, three of which were qualified. Committee members expressed confidence in the thoroughness of the process.

7.B Ground Transportation Update

The committee received an update on ground transportation changes related to the baggage handling system construction. Taxi operations were adjusted at the Ground Transportation Center, allowing drivers to queue remotely or leave the airport while maintaining service, supported by operations aides. TNC pickup areas remain separate to reduce congestion, and eDispatch technology will soon allow remote taxi queuing based on flight schedules. Communication with drivers and stakeholders has been ongoing to address any gaps. Additionally, a new Sunline Route 4 stop will be added at the airport in May, providing hourly service toward downtown, coordinated to minimize conflicts with other transit and commercial operations. No public comments were received.

8. COMMITTEE MEMBERS REPORTS AND REQUESTS:

Committee members had no formal reports. Members asked how to report operational issues noticed while traveling through the airport, such as minor maintenance concerns or temperature issues. Staff confirmed that issues can be reported via email, text, airport personnel, or the airport website (flypsp.com). It was noted that the down escalator is currently scheduled for maintenance.

Background



July 24, 2019

City Council approved the purchase of 614 Herman Miller airport seating

- 522 new seats to be added to the Bono Concourse for a total of 609 seats
- 80 new seats to be added to the Regional Jet Concourse (Agua Caliente Concourse) for a total of 424 seats

September 17, 2025

Airport Commission recommended the Measure J Oversight Commission recommend the approval of funding two Airport Capital Improvement Projects with Measure J Funds in the estimated amount of \$1,500,000.

- Terminal Seating and Charging Tables for an estimated cost of \$500,000
- Federal Inspection Station (FIS) for an estimated cost of \$1,000,000

October 16, 2025

Measure J Oversight Commission recommended to the City Council the approval of funding the two Airport Capital Improvement Projects.

March 11, 2026

City Council approved Measure J funding for the Airport.

Background



Existing Herman Miller Seating

- There are 609 Herman Miller seats in the Bono Concourse
- 147 seats have charging stations
- Airport staff will assess existing seating to determine condition
- FAA grant funds were not used to purchase the seats, and seats in good condition will be listed for sale through the Procurement Department's surplus sale site or stored for future use
- Seats in poor condition may be stripped for parts

Selection Process



Staff determined that it would be necessary to identify vendors that could provide seating options that would meet the following criteria:

- Vendor is included in a cooperative purchasing agreement for airport seating
- Provide an adequate number of seating for the \$500,000 budget
- Meets the Airport's design standard needs

Based on the provided criteria, staff shortlisted four vendors: Vitra, Herman Miller, Zoefftig, and Kusch

- Herman Miller quoted approximately \$1.4 million for 500 seats with tables
- Zoefftig requires a 50% deposit for orders

- 10-year warranty on MedaGate tandem seating
- 5-year warranty on SoftWait seating
- 2-year warranty on power modules; USB port module can be replaced in the field
- 5-year warranty on SoftWait upholstery; slip cover style for easy maintenance
- Minimal maintenance can be performed by Airport staff; components can be replaced and upholstery is slip cover; no units to be removed from service
- Wiping down furniture with a damp cloth with mild detergent is all that is required for keeping furniture clean; no harsh chemicals required, also not recommended
- Standard lead time is 16 – 20 weeks

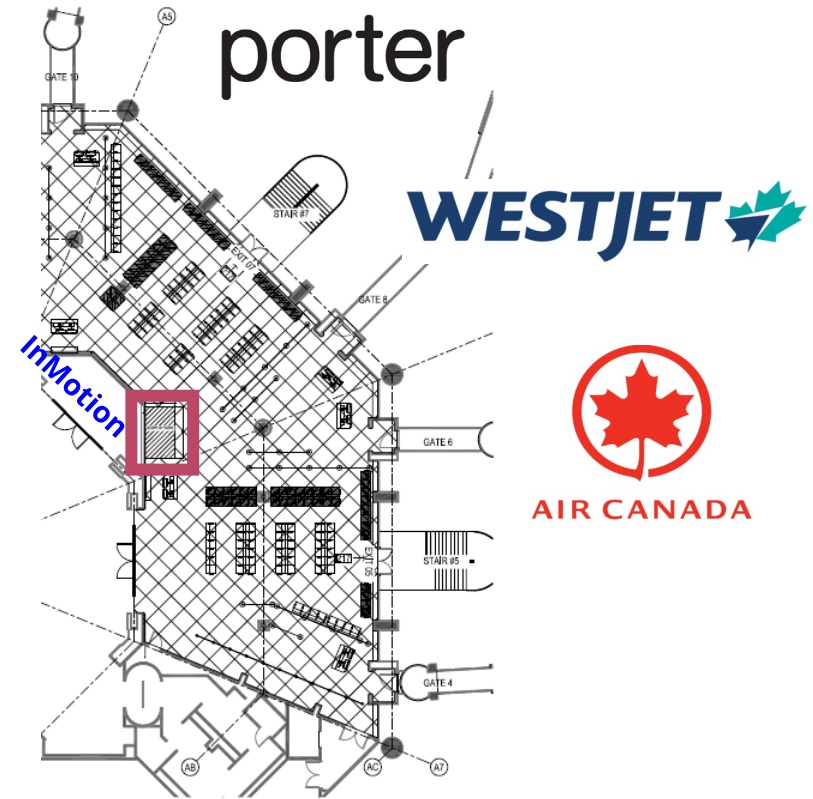
